FIGALE Survivor needs help

>> Foundation hosting fundraiser to assist survivor's return home

HIGHWAY resident thought she was going to make a difference teaching English in a "safe" country when she left South Africa for Korea a few weeks ago.

However, the 22-year-old's dreams were shattered after she was raped by a man who she be-

friended while she was sight-seeing one night.

In a statement to the Hillcrest Fever via the Jes Foord Foundation, the survivor, who cannot be named due to confidentiality, said she had befriended a Korean man who offered to show her where the bus terminal was in order for her to go home.

She said that the man then

pulled her into a DVD screening room and raped her.

Jes Foord, founder of the foundation, said, "She is far away from home having to deal with the rape, STD and pregnancy scare and feeling guilty about not fighting back.
